- **everywhere** *adverb* in or to every country or area of the world, or in or to every part of a place: Poverty affects children everywhere. | I've been looking everywhere for my keys.
- **everyplace** *adverb* *American English spoken* everywhere: There you are. I've been looking for you everyplace.
- **all over** *preposition, adverb* everywhere on a surface or in a place: Jack's clothes were all over the floor. | Teams from all over the world will be taking part. | Fry the potatoes until they are brown all over.
- **worldwide** *adverb, adjective* everywhere in the world: The Olympic Games are watched by people worldwide. | The show has a worldwide audience of 50 million viewers.
- **nationwide** *adverb, adjective* in all parts of a particular country: a nationwide study of adolescents | The company has over 200 stores nationwide.
- **throughout** *adverb, preposition* in every part of an area or place: The house is carpeted throughout. | He travelled throughout Scotland.
