If you describe sth as **unbelievable**, you probably don't believe that it is true or possible.Example Bank:

- It seems incredible to me that we didn't think of this before.
- Most people find this claim utterly incredible.
- You're pretty incredible, Barbara.
- Even today, the story seems incredible.
- He seemed to spend an incredible amount of money.
- I felt an incredible sense of relief.
- It was incredible but true.
- It's incredible to think that the affair had been going on for years.
- It's just incredible to me that only one person was hurt.
- She told me he was dead. It seemed incredible.
- Standing waiting for the marathon to start was the most incredible feeling.
- The demand for the new product has been quite incredible.
- The prize money is an incredible \$6 million.
- The speed of her recovery seems almost incredible.
