- a **↑bishop** of the highest rank, responsible for all the churches in a large area
- the Archbishop of Canterbury (= the head of the Church of England)

Word Origin:Old English, from **↑arch-** 'chief' + **biscop** (see **↑bishop**), replacing earlier heah-biscop 'high-bishop'.Culture:

In the **↑Church of England** there are two archbishops, the **↑Archbishop of Canterbury** and the **↑Archbishop of York**, who both have a place in the **↑House of Lords**. The **↑Archbishop of Westminster** is the **↑Roman Catholic** bishop of the highest rank in Britain. The title 'Your Grace' is used when talking to an archbishop and 'His Grace' when referring to one.

Example Bank:

- He was enthroned as archbishop in Canterbury Cathedral in 1980.
- He was made Archbishop of Milan.
