Word Origin:

late Middle English: from Old French **adjectif**, -ive, from Latin **adject-** 'added', from the verb **adicere**, from **ad-** 'towards' + **jacere** 'throw'. The term was originally used in the phrase noun adjective, translating Latin **nomen adjективum**, a translation of Greek **ονόμα επίθετον** 'attributive name'.

Example Bank:
