Word Origin:mid 19th cent.: from French *bureaucrate*, from *bureaucratie*, from *bureau*, originally baize (used to cover writing desks), from Old French *burel*, probably from *bure* 'dark brown', based on Greek *purros* 'red'.Example Bank:

- He was just another faceless bureaucrat.
- battles between political appointees and career bureaucrats
- We got caught up in the endless red tape of local bureaucrats.
