Word Origin:late Middle English (as a collective term): from ↑paste, influenced by Old French *pastaierie*.Example Bank:

- Bake until the pastry is crisp and golden.
- Brush the pastry with a little water.
- Cut the filo pastry into 10 cm strips.
- Line the tin with the pastry.
