to remove something that has been written down or stored in a computer:

- " His name was deleted from the list.
- " I deleted the file by mistake.

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THESAURUS

- **delete** to remove something that has been written down or stored in a computer: I think you should delete the second paragraph. | You can delete any files that are no longer required.
- **cut** to remove a section from a piece of writing or a film: You'll have to cut some of your essay if it's over 1,500 words. | A couple of scenes had to be cut because they were too violent.
- **cross something out** to draw a line through a word to show that it was a mistake or that you want to change what you have written: If you make a mistake in the exam, just cross it out. | I've crossed out the names of people who can't come.
- **rub something out** *British English*, **erase** *American English* to remove writing or pictures from paper with a rubber, or from a board with a cloth: Use a pencil so you can rub out your mistakes. | I had to rub the whole thing out and start again.
- **erase** to remove sounds or pictures that have been recorded on a machine: You can erase the tape or record over it. | Somehow all my photographs had been erased.
