 the director hovered her typewriter waiting for her to finish the letter - директор застыл над её машинкой, ожидая, пока она закончит письмо

 3. (*over, around*) вертеться, болтаться, ходить вокруг кого-л., топтаться, толпиться вокруг кого-л.

- He hovered nervously in the doorway.

Word Origin:late Middle English: from archaic *hove* 'hover, linger', of unknown origin.Example Bank:

- He was hovering anxiously outside.
- Phoebe was hovering in the background, uncertain what to do.
- She couldn't bear him hovering around her.
- She hovered uncertainly near the front door.
- A police helicopter hovered overhead
- The hawk hovered in the air and then plunged to the ground.
