vehicles that navigate the streets - *образн.* транспорт, снующий по улицам

2. управлять (*судном и т. п.*)

to navigate a ship - вести корабль
to navigate a plane - управлять самолётом

3. проводить (*мероприятие*); направлять (*переговоры*)

to navigate a bill through Parliament - проталкивать законопроект через парламент

4. *амер. разг.* брести, плестись (*преим. о пьяных*)

the fellow was hardly able to navigate - парень еле /едва/ держался на ногах
he was well enough to navigate under his own power - он настолько поправился, что мог передвигаться без посторонней помощи

Word Origin:

late 16th cent. (in the sense 'travel in a ship'): from Latin **navigat** 'sailed', from the verb **navigare**, from **navis** 'ship' + **agere** 'drive'.
