1. **shush!** *spoken* used to tell someone, especially a child, to be quiet **SYN** shh:  
" 'Shush!' said Jerry. 'Not so loud.'
2. [**transitive**] to tell someone to be very quiet, especially by putting your fingers against your lips or by saying 'shush':  
He started to cry and Francesca shushed him.
