1. 1) радовать

a letter from you rejoiced my heart - ваше письмо меня очень обрадовало

2) (часто in, at) радоваться

to rejoice at the good news - радоваться добрым вестям

to rejoice at seeing smb. - обрадоваться кому-л.

to rejoice in life's pleasures [in one's youth] - наслаждаться радостями жизни [собственной молодостью]

2. (in) *шутл.* с гордостью носить (имя)

he rejoices in the name of Bloggs - он носит гордую фамилию Блоггс, его величают Блоггсом

this unpleasant man rejoices in the name of scholar - эта неприятная личность именует себя учёным

Word Origin:Middle English (in the sense 'cause joy to'): from Old French *rejoiss-*, lengthened stem of *rejoir*, from *re-* (expressing intensive force) + *joir* 'experience joy'.**rejoice**
