- The events that led up to the murder were shown in a series of flashbacks.
- The reader is told the story **in flashback** .

2. **countable** a sudden, very clear, strong memory of sth that happened in the past that is so real you feel that you are living through the experience again

- war veterans suffering from nightmares and flashbacks

2. **[countable]** a sudden very clear memory of something that happened to you in the past:Eaton still has flashbacks of the crash.3. **[countable]** an occasion when someone has the same bad feeling that they had when they took an illegal drug in the past:

Many users of this drug experience flashbacks.

4. **[countable] technical** a burning gas or liquid that moves back into a tube or container**flashback**
