Word Origin:

[**endurance**] late 15th cent. (in the sense 'continued existence, ability to last'; formerly also as indurance): from Old French, from **endurer** 'make hard', from Latin **indurare** 'harden', from **in-** 'in' + **durus** 'hard'.
