Word Origin:late Middle English (denoting a short descriptive or dedicatory passage at the beginning of a book): from Latin *inscriptio(n-)*, from the verb *inscribere*, from *in-* ‘into’ + *scribere* ‘write’.Example Bank:

- The inscription bears the date 1655.
- The monument carries the inscription: ‘To the fallen in two world wars’.
- The monument carries the inscription: ‘To the fallen’.
- The simple inscription on her grave reads: ‘She sleeps in peace.’
