Word Origin:

late 19th cent.: from French **égalitaire**, from **égal** ‘equal’ , from Latin **aequalis**, from **aequus** ‘even, level, equal’ .

Example Bank:

- a highly egalitarian system of taxation
- a truly egalitarian society
