story • an account, often spoken, of what happened to sb or of how sth happened; a report of events in a newspaper, magazine or news broadcast: = It was many years before the full story was made public.  $\diamond$ = the front-page story

account • a written or spoken description of sth that has happened: • She gave the police a full account of the incident.

# report or account?

A report is always of recent events, especially news. An account may be of recent or past events.

version • a description of an event from the point of view of a particular person or group of people: • She gave us her version of what had happened that day.
