Syn: ↑deficit

- a shortfall of over 500 000 tonnes in the grain supply
- Several staff were made redundant to meet a shortfall of funds.

Example Bank:

- Several workers were laid off to meet a shortfall of funds.
- The company is facing a \$2 billion shortfall in revenue
- The estimated shortfall for this financial year is \$1. 2million.
