Word Origin:

mid 16th cent. (denoting an index or catalogue): from late Latin **repertorium**, from Latin **reperit-** 'found, discovered', from the verb **reperire**. Sense 1 (arising from the fact that a company has a "repertory" of pieces for performance) dates from the late 19th cent.
